In 2024, we tested the limits of how many

repertory and first-run films we could program. And what we found was: you kept coming back! 
FILM ON FILM

COOLDGE CLASSROM


In 2024, we launched Coolidge Classroom, our free field trip program for middle and high school students across Greater Boston.
